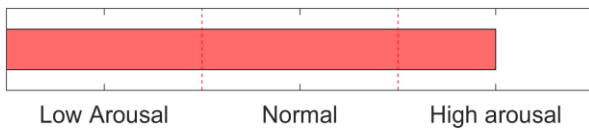

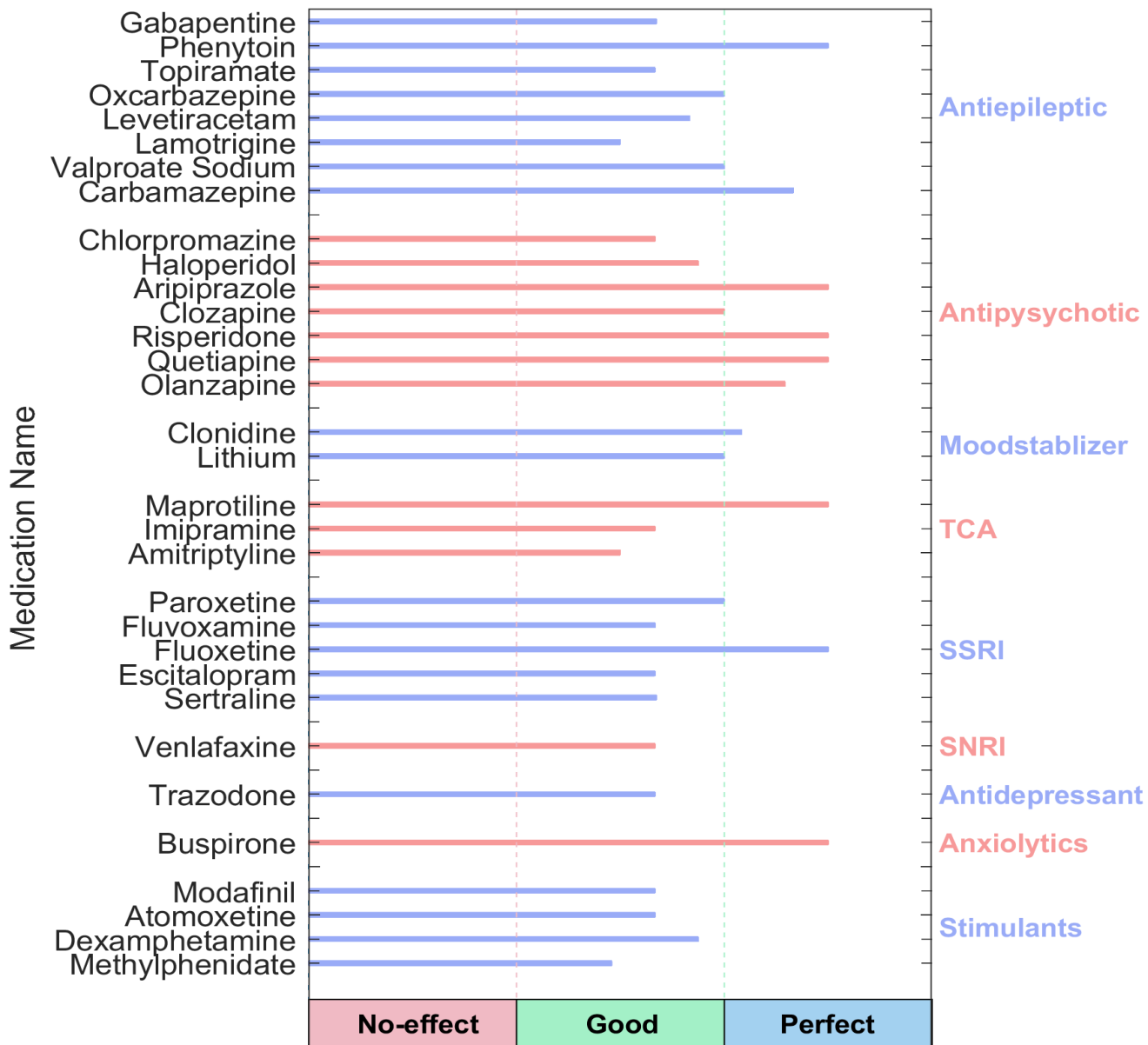

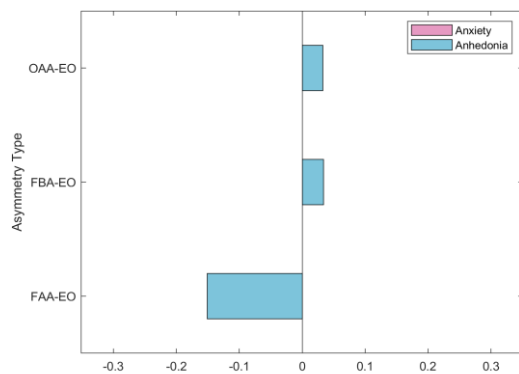
Explanation

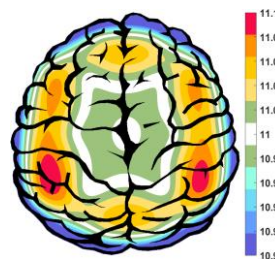
Medication Recommendation

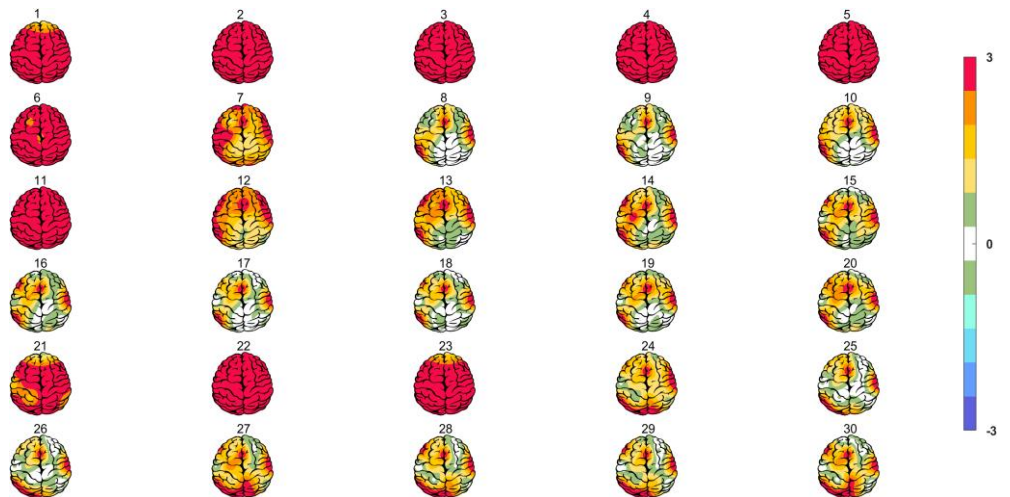

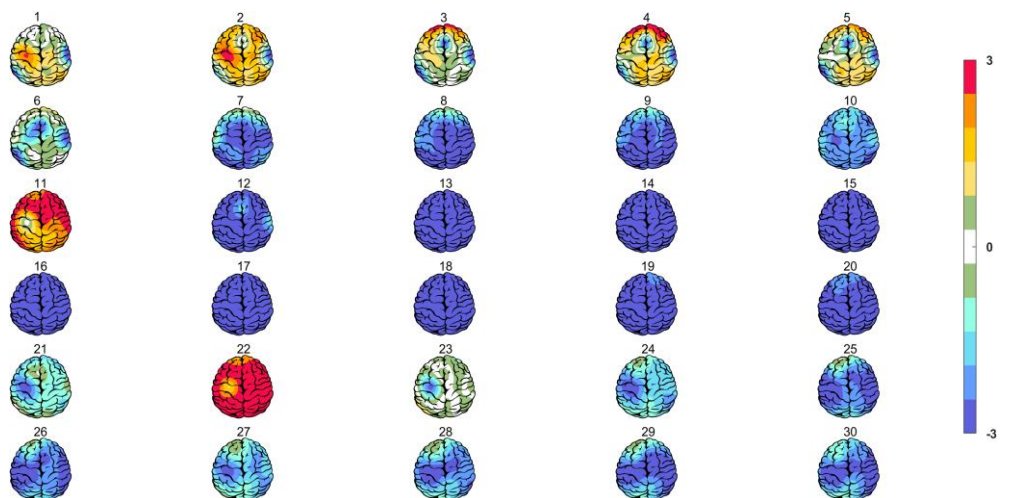
Frontal APF= 11.00

Posterior APF= 11.00

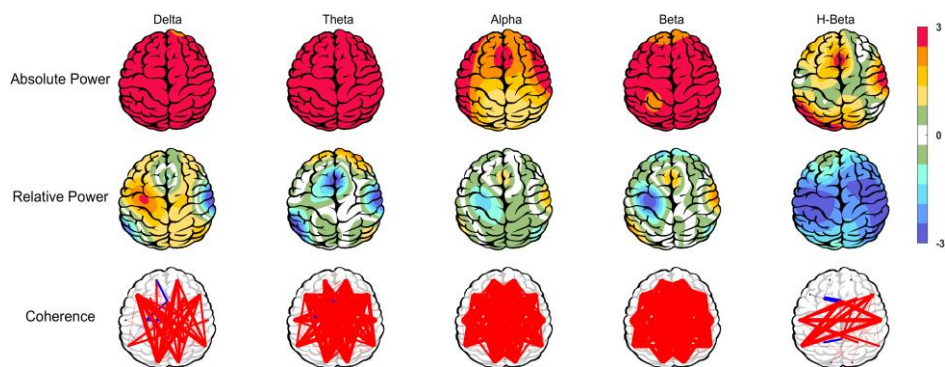
Absolute Power-Eye Open (EO)



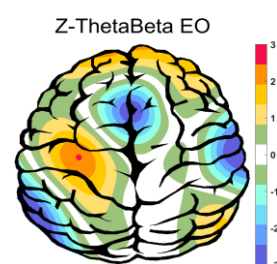
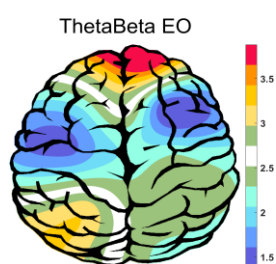
Relative Power-Eye Open (EO)



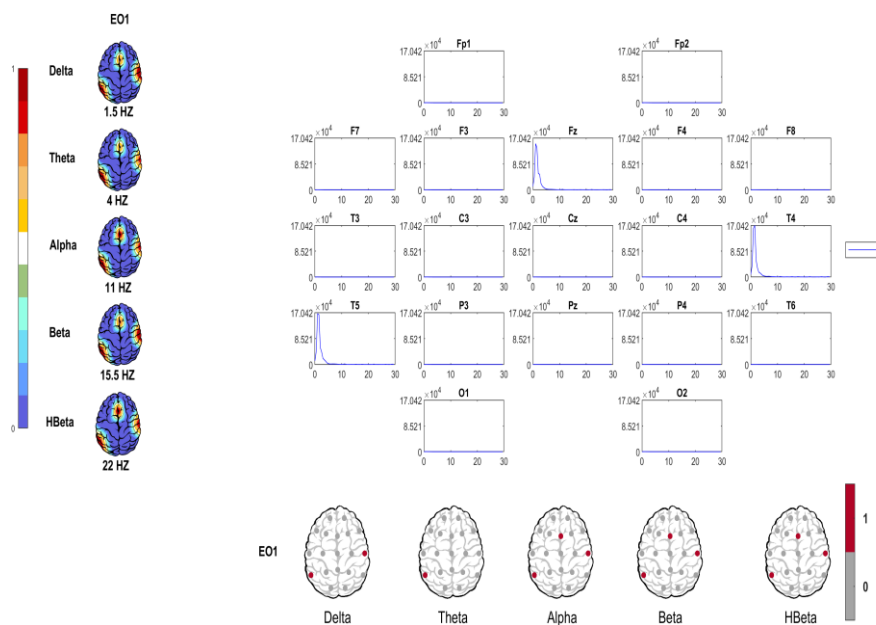
